<p>Daily phonics- your child should practice all the sounds on the sound mats each day and practice reading words containing these sounds. Visit this site for lots of fun games and activities. We are currently going through and revising Phase 5. Additionally, recapping sounds in Phase 3 is advised. If you do not have a copy there is YouTube videos available of people reading the text, it is necessary to have a recap of the story for your child to be able to complete the writing tasks.</p>	<p><u>Lesson starters</u> Some fun games to play about addition and subtraction https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/5-7-years/addition-and-subtraction</p> <p>Counting practise games to start the lesson:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Get some buttons/counters/pennies. See how many ways you can make a number using part part whole and the counters. E.g collect 20 buttons and see how many number bonds to 20 you can write.• Practise counting forwards and backwards to 100• Practise counting in 2s. You could use pairs of socks to illustrate this. <p><u>Tasks – White Rose Maths - Pick a task to do each day</u> This week they focus on addition and subtraction. Pick one task to complete each day.

1. Choose one of the places that the snail and the whale visit and write a diary entry as the snail about her time there.
2. In the story, the whale gets stuck on the beach. Can you write a letter to the school children asking for their help to save the whale?
3. The snail and the whale travel across the ocean to visit many places together. Can you use the ocean as the main setting and write a description of it? (If they were in the middle of the ocean, what would they see around them, what would they hear, would they see other creatures?)
4. Imagine you were the snail in the story, and you could choose a place to visit with the whale. Where would you go? Write a list of items you would pack in your bag to take with you and explain why you would take them.
5. If you could go on an adventure on the back of the whale, who would you take with you and why?
