<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Your child should continue to read a chapter from their reading book or library book each day. Read 'The Dragon Machine' by Helen Ward https://www.booktrust.org.uk/books-and-reading/have-some-fun/storybooks-and-games/the-dragon-machine/ Does this story remind you of a book you have read in year 3 at school? What parts of the story are similar? What is different? Did you enjoy the story? Why? Visit Twinkl and search for 'Comprehension Activity about India'. Read the text and complete the comprehension questions. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Log in to Times Table Rockstars daily. Angles and shape Work through the lessons 1-5 from Oak National Academy. https://www.thenational.academy/online-classroom/year-3/maths#subjects Get a piece of paper and ask your child to show everything they know about 2D and 3D shapes. This could be pictures, diagrams, nets of shapes, lines of symmetry, etc. They will probably need a ruler. Perhaps they can label the length of the sides of the shapes and work out the perimeter. They can be as creative as they want to be. Look out for 2D and 3D shaped objects around your house.

Write a non-chronological report about this interesting part of the world. Try to include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ a title and opening sentences ➤ paragraphs with sub headings ➤ tables/pictures/diagrams ➤ a conclusion - summary of key points. Imagine you travel to India for a holiday. Write a postcard to your friend telling them about your trip. Make a list of foods found in India. Perhaps you could write out a recipe for a typical Indian dish.
<p>Learning project: India The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about different parts of the world.</p>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Find out about Rangoli patterns. Copy one or create one of your own. Locate India on a world map. Find out what the Indian Flag looks like and have a go at drawing it. The Taj Mahal is one of the most impressive buildings in the world. Find out about this beautiful building. What is it made from? Why was it built? How much did it cost to build? On the Taj Mahal there are lots of lines of symmetry, can you spot some? Why not try some Bollywood dance moves. There's an example of an Indian Dance on - You tube - Les Mills BORN TO MOVE 6-7 year old class. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=zodMIu0_CfI or https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=GHCqRsrQwNU (from 3mins 30secs) Most people in India are Hindus. Can you find out about this fascinating religion? You could draw one of the Hindu Gods.
