I included a free code for a Twinkl account in your lockdown packs.</p> <p><b>Practical activities</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Print an empty 100 square grid and see how many of the numbers you can write in.</li><li>• Play bingo with numbers up to 100 to test the children’s number recognition.</li><li>• Which number is bigger. Write two numbers and get the child to work out which one is bigger and which one is smaller (if possible, ask your child to build each number out of objects too. A pen could stand for ‘10’ and a button could be a ‘one’). (numbers up to 100).</li><li>• Ordering numbers. Write 5 numbers on pieces of paper or post it notes. Get your child to order them from biggest to smallest. (numbers up to 100).</li></ul> <p>Additional maths tasks are available on multiplication and division on MyMaths.</p>

Make a list of things that you could use a cardboard box for.</li> <li>2. The book has no direct speech. Think of some thought bubbles to accompany the illustrations in the book. Write them down.</li> <li>3. Birt and Etho are best friends. Write about what makes a good friend.</li> <li>4. Write a book review about the book. What did you like about the book? What did you not like?</li> <li>5. Write a story about an adventure you have done with your best friend. What is your favourite thing to do together?</li> </ol>
