<p data-bbox="248 595 638 629"><u>The Summer Reading Challenge</u></p> <p data-bbox="108 629 746 801">The Summer Reading Challenge, presented by The Reading Agency and funded by Arts Council England, encourages children aged 4 to 11 to set themselves a reading challenge to encourage reading over the summer.</p> <p data-bbox="108 844 764 947">Each year the Challenge, delivered with the support of public libraries, motivates over 700,000 children to keep reading to build their skills and confidence.</p> <p data-bbox="108 987 764 1196">This year, Silly Squad, the Summer Reading Challenge 2020, will celebrate funny books, happiness and laughter. Children taking part in the Challenge will join the Silly Squad, an adventurous team of animals who love to have a laugh and get stuck in to all different kinds of funny books!</p> <p data-bbox="108 1236 764 1444">With the disruption caused by COVID-19 and the impact of social distancing on schools and public libraries, the 2020 Challenge will launch as a digital activity to keep children reading over the summer and support parents and carers with children already at home.</p> <p data-bbox="395 1487 491 1520"><u>Phonics</u></p> <p data-bbox="108 1523 770 1767">Daily phonics- your child should practice all the sounds on the sound mats each day and practice reading words containing these sounds. Visit this site for lots of fun games and activities. We are currently going through and revising Phase 5. Additionally, recapping sounds in Phase 3 is advised. Weekly Writing Tasks

Please concentrate on using capital letters, full stops, finger spaces, adjectives and ensuring that letters are correctly formed and on the line. Try and include 'and' into your sentences and 'because'.

Pick one task to complete each day.

Can you think of a memory from each topic? Our topics have been 'Dinosaurs', 'Bright Lights Big City', 'Superheroes' and 'Memory Box'. What did you enjoy and why? Have a chat about all your memories and ask questions to encourage discussion.

Some ideas to get you started are...

Donald the diplodocus visiting our class, our Queen's tea party, learning about the fire of London, making clay superheroes and learning about real life superheroes, the Christmas performance, the teddy bears picnic and sharing our memory boxes.

- Draw a picture of your favourite memory from each topic and write a sentence underneath it to caption it.
- Concentrate on your favourite thing that we did. Write a list of everything that happened that day/during that event.
- Draw a picture of your favourite day and label it using adjectives. E,g the green grass, the soft teddy bear.
- Look at your list of things that happened on your favourite day. Now write a recount of what happened. Remember to describe what happened, how you felt, which friends were there, what you liked about it.
Remember your full stops, finger spaces and capital letters. Take a few days writing it to create a lovely final piece of work. Please send me an email of your favourite memories as I would love to read them.

Learning project for this week:

Geography

- Talk with your parents about different places you might go and visit during the summer holidays, such as parks or farms. Look to see where they are on a map. How far are they? Guess if you think you will walk or drive there. How long do you think it will take? What is around the place you are going to?

PE
