A message from Cleveland Police



As you may have seen recently either in person or in our social media, your local neighbourhood officers have been present at schools in the Marton and Nunthorpe areas. We have responded to the numerous complaints we have received regarding the manner of driving as children are being dropped off or being collected from school. Over a number of weeks, we have spoken to drivers. We have mainly chosen to politely request a driver to move their vehicle and find an alternative place to stop. Our focus for this action has always been child safety during the morning drop off or the evening collection periods. Unfortunately, some drivers have persisted in parking or stopping where they shouldn't.

Moving forward we will now issue penalty notices to drivers who are parked or temporarily stopped in areas which should be kept clear. The most common problems we deal with are, vehicles blocking driveways or parked on ZIG ZAG areas which must be kept clear.

The image is a scan of our Penalty Note Book and details the cost of fines that can be issued.

HY80020 would apply to a vehicle blocking a driveway. The penalty is ± 30

RT88751 would apply to a vehicle being present on the ZIG ZAG area. The penalty is £50.

We hope that all drivers will share our concerns for child safety and be mindful of where they place their cars at our schools as we move into this next phase of more positive action.
